



Accessing Work Offline

Some of your students may need to access coursework offline. No problem! Here's what students are still able to do from Chromebooks while offline:

- View and Edit Docs, Slides, and Sheets
- Access Canvas ePub course information
- Access the text to websites that they have saved

However, they will not be able to

- Create new documents (Have them create BEFORE they leave school so they can edit at home.)
- Submit assignments through Canvas (They'll need to submit when they return to school.)
- Click links on websites they have saved.
- Watch YouTube videos
